





## THE WORD


Zephaniah 1:7-16 7 Be silent in the presence of the Lord GOD; For the day of the LORD is at hand, For the LORD has prepared a sacrifice; He has invited His guests. <sup>8</sup> "And it shall be, In the day of the LORD'S sacrifice, That I will punish the princes and the king's children, And all such as are clothed with foreign apparel. <sup>9</sup> In the same day I will punish All those who leap over the threshold, Who fill their masters' houses with violence and deceit. <sup>10</sup> "And there shall be on that day," says the LORD, "The sound of a mournful cry from the Fish Gate, A wailing from the Second Quarter, And a loud crashing from the hills. <sup>11</sup> Wail, you inhabitants of Maktesh!
